Gurley McCoy Bynum Genealogy

GREAT-GRANDFATHER AND GREAT-GRANDMOTHER

Asa Bynum (10/09/1781 – 5/06/1833) was born in North Carolina. He married Rebecca Murphree (died 1844) and moved to Alabama in 1819. They had seven sons and three daughters: James, Isaac, Solomon, William, Edith, Sallie, **Daniel**, Elijah, Jesse, Asa, and Rebecca. Asa was a Primitive Baptist preacher and was in the congregation when Mt. Mariah Baptist church was organized in 1822, seven miles northeast of Oneonta, AL.

As a and Rebecca had at least one slave (a cook). After As a died, several outhouses near the house burned. The Sheriff was called to investigate and a slave cook confessed that she filled a coffee pot full of hot coals and threw them into the buildings. The cook was taken to Benton County and sold.

GRANDFATHER AND GRANDMOTHER

Daniel Bynum (1817 – 1903) lived in Pendleton, Anderson County, SC. He married Elizabeth Murphree (born about 1817) in 1837. They had five sons and four daughters: Ellis (born 1838); **Alexander** (born 1840); James (born 1842; killed in service as a Confederate soldier in 1865); Uriah (born 1848 and died in 1897 from a kick by a horse); Dalton (born 1862); Sarah (born 1844); Artamisie (born 1850); Delia (died in early youth); and Kittie (born 1854).

FATHER and MOTHER

<u>Alexander Daniel Bynum</u> (9/03/1840 – 6/16/1915) married <u>Susanna Elizabeth Major</u> (8/25/1840 – 6/13/1890) on 4/18/1861 in Blount County, AL. They lived in Oneonta, Blount County, AL, and are buried in Old Liberty Cemetery, Oneonta, AL. They had three sons and three daughters.

1870 Census Residence: Blount County, AL. Household = AD Bynum (28), SE Bynum (27), and Brucy C (1).

1880 Census Residence: Blountsville, Blount County, AL. Census data: Head of household (39, farmer) with wife Elizabeth (38, house keeper), son Brucy C (11), and son Gurley (1 year old).

1910 Census Residence: Birmingham, Jefferson County, AL. (See below.)

Alexander D. Bynum and Susanna Elizabeth Bynum had 6 children: Tracy, Brucy C, Zula, Beulah, Gurley McCoy, and Hallie Gay.

Alexander D. Bynum was a Private in Company I of the 49th Alabama Infantry, CSA. A metal CSA marker is on his grave at Old Liberty Cemetery, Oneonta, AL.

[Susanna Elizabeth (Major) Bynum had a sister, Amanda Jane Major, who married Uriah William Bynum (brother of Alexander D. Bynum). See NOTE 1.]

Brucy C Bynum 5/11/1869 – 10/17/1923 (Male). He was educated at the Southern University at Greensboro. He taught school in Blount County, AL, for 12 years. After leaving teaching, he was a contractor and was also in the mercantile business. He married Mary Handley (1876 – 1896) in 1890. Mary died after six years of marriage. They had no children. Brucy C. died on 10/17/1923 in Largo, Pinellas County, FL, and is buried at Oak Hill Cemetery in Birmingham, Jefferson County, AL. [NOTE: Largo is where Hallie Gay and Charlie McMullen lived. He may have lived with them prior to his death.]

1880 Census Residence: Blountsville, Blount County, AL. Household = Alexander (39), S. Elizabeth (38), Brucy C (11), and Gurley (1).

1900 Census Residence: Thompson Crossroads, Blount County, AL. Census data: Head of household = Brucy C (31, single, farmer) with father AD Bynum (59, widowed, farm laborer), brother Gurley McCoy (male, 21, single, teacher), sister Hallie G (female, 17), and cousin Lorna Bynum (female, 29, single, teacher).

1910 Census Residence: Birmingham, Jefferson County, AL. Census data: Head of household = Brucy C (40 years old, married 3 years, no children, house contractor); in same household was father AD Bynum (69 years old, widowed) and [cousin] Lona Bynum (female, 38 years, single, no children, manager retail store).

Gurley McCoy was born in Blount County, AL. Gurley McCoy married Minnie Sophia Burns (12/12/1883 – 3/03/1980) on 12/13/1906 in Blount County, AL. Minnie Burns was born at Burns Mill (Wedowee), AL. They had six children: Mildred Elizabeth, Edward Bruce, Eugene McCoy, Maurice Norton, Hallie Corinne, and Joseph Stansell.

Hallie Gay Bynum 10/03/1881 – 11/22/1971 (Female)

Born in Blount County, AL. Graduated University of Alabama. Hallie Gay married Clark Ellis (2/28/1879 – 3/07/1917) in 1902. Clark was a Methodist minister. Clark died in Birmingham, AL, at age 38 from lung cancer. He is buried in Oak Hill Cemetery, Oneonta, AL. Clark and Hallie Gay had one daughter, Grace Ellis, born 1904.

After Clark Ellis died, Hallie Gay married Charlie McMullen (6/09/1874 – 9/03/1959). Charlie and Hallie Gay had one daughter, Elna McMullen, born 1925.

Hallie died 11/22/1971 in San Diego, CA, at age 89. She is buried in Largo, Pinellas County, FL.

1900 Census Residence: Thompson Crossroads, Blount County, AL 1930, 1940, and 1945 FL census show Charlie, Hallie, and Elna in Pinellas County, FL. 1945 FL State census: Hallie (63), Charlie (70), and Elna (20) lived in Largo, Pinellas County, FL.

GURLEY MCCOY BYNUM AND MINNIE SOPHIA BURNS

Gurley McCoy Bynum (3/13/1879 – 1/14/1968) was born in Blount County, AL. Gurley McCoy entered the law school of the University of Alabama in 1902, and received a law degree from the university in 1904. Gurley McCoy and Theron Burns opened a law practice in Wedowee, AL, in 1904. Gurley McCoy married Minnie Sophia Burns (12/12/1883 – 3/03/1980) on 12/13/1906 in Blount County, AL. Minnie Burns was born at Burns Mill, AL. Gurley and Minnie were married in the living room of her home at Burns Mill. After six years of lawyering, Gurley McCoy surrendered to the Lord and began preaching as a Methodist minister, which he did for the remainder of his life. He served in the North Alabama Methodist Conference. Gurley McCoy and Minnie had six children: Mildred Elizabeth Bynum (11/28/1907 – 6/17/2001); Edward Bruce Bynum (4/22/1910 – 9/26/2000); Eugene McCoy Bynum (7/10/1912 – 3/28/2008); Maurice Norton Bynum (9/01/1914 – 6/17/1989); Hallie Corinne (Bynum) Cloud (6/19/1917 – 1/22/2013); and Joseph Stansell Bynum (4/06/1920 – 2/08/2009).

Susanna Elizabeth (Major) Bynum's sister, Amanda Jane Major (9/02/1850 – 6/09/1888), married Uriah William Bynum (8/25/1848 – 8/05/1897) on 11/26/1868 in Oneonta, Blount County, AL. Uriah was the brother of Alexander D. Bynum. Amanda Jane Bynum died on 6/09/1888 and Uriah Bynum married Rachel Bridget Cowden on 11/27/1888. Uriah had eight children. Uriah Bynum was kicked by a horse and died 8/05/1897. He is buried in Shiloh Cemetery in Chepultepec, Blount County, AL.

The Southern Democrat", Thursday, August 12, 1897

"It is with sad heart that we chronicle the death of Mr. Uriah W. Bynum which occurred at his home near this place last Thursday about noon. He was kicked by a horse Tuesday about noon and suffered great agony for about 48 hours when death came to this relief. Mr. Bynum in a few days would have been 49 years old and 27 years of that time he spent as a steward in the M. E. church, South. He was a good man and numbered his friends by the score. When questions of morality came up he was always on the right side. When he came to die he said he had made some mistakes in his life by that if he had it to live over against he didn't know that he could do it better. There are very few people that can say this. In his death the wife loses a devoted husband, the children an affectionate father, the church one of its most earnest workers, and the community one of its most enterprising and patriotic citizens. The funeral service took place at Chepultepec Friday morning. The I.O.O.F. of which he was a faithful member, took part in the service. The funeral was largely attended."
